### HAVE YOU SEEN OUR PROJECT COMPASSION WALL?

Every week during Lent the children in Year 6 visit classrooms to collect money raised by the children in each classroom. For every \$5 raised, the children will receive a small cut out shape representing a book which they can add to the larger book on the brick wall.

The theme for Project Compassion 2018 is "A Just Future". The Year 6 students agreed that to promote a 'just future' there needs to be education.

Throughout Project Compassion 2018, inspiring stories from Nepal, Cambodia, Jordan, Australia, Mozambique and the Philippines will be shared, highlighting the importance of working hand in hand with communities around the world.



Donations to Project Compassion allow Caritas Australia, the Catholic Agency for International Aid and Development, to work towards this creation of a more just and fair world for whole communities.

The aim is for children to see how 'collectively' as a school community we can work together to raise money and make a difference for those less fortunate than ourselves.

### **THIS WEEK WE MEET EVANGELINE**

Evangeline is strengthening Aboriginal culture, while making a living for herself and creating opportunities for her community. Featured in Project Compassion 2016, Evangeline was employed by the Caritas Australia supported Djilpin Arts Aboriginal Corporation and quickly rose to the role of Senior Artsworke



Her work at Djilpin Arts has supported the organisation's growth from a multi-media project to a multi-level contemporary arts and culture centre. An example of excellence in Indigenous tourism, it's now a key employer for young people in the remote Northern Territory community of Beswick (Wugularr).

This year, in 2018, Evangeline is busy guiding tourists, coordinating cultural activities and helping community members to practice and market their arts, such as weaving and jewellery-making.

"Now we have a new gallery up. And we have our new kitchens, we look after these and we now maintain this to make sure it's running okay and in good condition. We're also trying to open up another tour for tourists to go around the waterfall, we're just planning that now."

Evangeline's career has flourished and she has become an inspirational youth leader.

Evangeline says that Caritas Australia's support for Djilpin Arts, through Project Compassion, is vital for all Wugularr's young people. Although their families do their best to pass on knowledge, Elders are dying and she is keen to spearhead the preservation of culture and lore for future generations. "It's good for them to learn and to keep their culture strong," Evangeline says.

### **THIS WEEK WE ALSO MEET DITOSA**

Ditosa is a young girl from Mozambique who hopes to go to university and become a police officer. Featured in Project Compassion 2013, Ditosa faced a challenging future with food scarcity, little education and few job prospects. Cared for by her grandmother and aunt, after her parents died of AIDS-related illnesses, they also lost their home and livelihoods in severe flooding.

Thanks to the support of Project Compassion, Caritas Australia and Caritas Regional Chokwe (CRC) helped Ditosa's family to build a new house and assisted with transport fees, school materials and fees, to help Ditosa to stay at school.

Ditosa attended the Matuba Children's Centre (set up by Caritas in 2007) which provides vulnerable children, like Ditosa, with lunch, study help, and computer and income-generating skills training.

In 2018, Ditosa has graduated from school and is ambitious for the future.

"Without the support of the people from Australia and Caritas I would not have been given this opportunity to continue my schooling."



Ditosa dreams of going to university to continue studying and secure an even brighter future.

As a whole school community, we have raised \$1632.05 so far in donations already which is amazing!

We thank you in advance for your support for this extraordinary, ongoing demonstration of faith, love and generosity.

**NAPLAN**

As we move towards the end of Term 1, focus on the annual NAPLAN testing period becomes evident in the media, and topical for families. All of our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be involved in NAPLAN in Week 5 in Term 2. The dates and specifics for NAPLAN 2018 are as follows:

Tuesday 15 <sup>th</sup> May	Wednesday 16 <sup>th</sup> May	Thursday 17 <sup>th</sup> May

<b>Writing</b> <i>(40 minutes)</i>		

NAPLAN, stands for National Assessment Program ~ Literacy and Numeracy, and is a standardised, compulsory testing period for all Australian students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9. All students complete the tests on the same days each year, with NAPLAN being conducted on **Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>** this year.

Our Classroom Teachers will be preparing all of our students, to ensure they have an understanding of expectations of the tests, as well as having feelings of comfort and ease, as they move towards this testing period.

At the start of Term 2, all Year 3 and Year 5 families will receive further information around the testing, specifically equipment required, time specifics of the tests, and preparation processes occurring at school.

If any families have any concerns or questions around NAPLAN, please do not hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher.

### Student Support Team: Speech Language Impairment Parent Information Session

Throughout Term 1, our school Student Support Team has worked with our wonderful teachers, supporting all of our students to be reaching their full potentials. The Student Support Team work were large numbers of students, in classrooms, with teachers and individually, to support learning needs, as well as emotional and wellbeing needs.

Throughout 2017, our school ran a variety of parent information sessions, to support our students in a variety of ways. In Term 2, these parent information sessions will begin once again. Our first session will be a parent session, run by Janette Lewis, our School Based Speech Pathologist, providing parents with information around **Speech Language Impairments, and Communication Delays**. Janette will provide professional and practical information around SLI; symptoms of the impairment, supporting students at home, therapy needs, and moving towards formal diagnoses and funded support within schools.






Dear Friends

As we enter Holy week let us reflect on the days ahead.

The feast of Easter means various things - holidays, chocolates and time with family. For Christians it means much more. The days leading up to Easter Sunday are central in the Church's calendar.

The Church invites us to take part in the liturgies of the Easter Triduum – the Three Holy Days that begin with the evening Mass of Holy Thursday and end with Mass on Easter Sunday.

On these Three Holy Days, Christians remember the life, death and resurrection of Jesus in a way that doesn't drag us back into the past but touches our very lives here and now. It is a time of gathering, remembering, praying, silence, rejoicing.

So how are we going to keep these days? How are we as a Christian family going to be faithful to our baptism? How are we going to take our rightful place in these gatherings so that we can experience the promise of new life, here in the midst of all that is happening in our lives?

I would like to invite you to reflect on these days. I invite you to be present as the Church gathers, to allow yourselves the chance to touch death and more especially resurrection, so that we can all live truly as God's people.

In the centre of this brochure you will find a description of the various liturgies and on the back page the timetable for the next week.

## Palm/Passion Sunday

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

It is also called Passion Sunday because on this day we read the story of the last days in the life of Jesus, this year from St Mark.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and you may choose keep the palms for the year or they may be returned to the Church. Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the follow year's Ash Wednesday observance.



## THE SACRED TRIDUUM – THREE HOLY DAYS

### Holy Thursday – Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper

Holy Thursday brings an end to Lent.

The central observance of Holy Thursday is the ritual re-enactment of the Last Supper at Mass. This event is celebrated at every Mass, as part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, but it is specially commemorated on Holy Thursday. After listening to the Scripture we do something we would not normally do, we wash feet! This ritual imitates Jesus' Last Supper action of humility and service.

Jesus gave us this image of what the church should look like, feel like, and act like and so we do likewise since are servants of one another. We then celebrate the Eucharist. Remembering the institution of the Holy Eucharist is the heart of the Holy Thursday observance. You will notice that the Tabernacle is open and empty! This Eucharist serves to highlight our unity with Jesus and one another and so we all receive communion consecrated at this Mass. At the end of the Mass the Blessed Sacrament is transferred to an 'Altar of Repose' in the Parish Hall, and the tabernacle in the Church is emptied so that all might receive communion from bread consecrated at this Mass.

After placing the consecrated bread in the tabernacle, an atmosphere of quiet waiting with the Lord begins. The Altar in the Church is stripped and all folwers and decorations removed. This action is symbolic of the stripping of Christ before the crucifixion.

**We are invited to stay a while and pray and then leave in silence.**



### Good Friday – Celebration of the Lord’s Passion

Good Friday is a day of fasting within the Church. We pray at length for the world’s needs.

There is no Mass and no celebration of the Eucharist on Good Friday. The liturgy in the afternoon, at 3.00pm - the ninth hour - commemorates the death of Christ. We read the Passion, the story of Christ’s last hours and then we venerate the cross as we come forward one by one to do reverence with a kiss, or a bow or a genuflection. After prayers for the World, Church and ourselves we join together in praying the ‘Our Father’ and then we receive communion which comes from hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday.



We gather in silence on this day and leave in silence.

### Holy Saturday – The Easter Vigil

This is the high point of the liturgical year. This is the ‘Night of nights’. The atmosphere in the church is different: the holy water fonts are drained, all the lights are out, the tabernacle is empty. The service begins outside the church. A new fire is lit and blessed.



A Paschal Candle is prepared and the Priest lights the candle from the new fire, we light our own candles from this one light and proclaim in song that Christ is risen and in our midst. We then listen to some the most powerful scriptures in the Bible reminding us of all that God has done for us and all the God is doing for us. We then bless water and we all renew our Baptism vows acknowledging the tenets of our Faith, reminding us that we are one in Jesus’ dying and rising. Together we go to the table and celebrate the Easter Eucharist.

We leave rejoicing in God’s gift of Life.

### EASTER SUNDAY

Easter Sunday begins fifty days of rejoicing that will culminate on Pentecost Sunday. Although Easter Sunday mass is similar to every Sunday, as at the Vigil we are renewed in our Baptism.

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


